### **STEM MAD**

*The presentation rooms at the Melbourne Catholic Leadership Centre in East Melbourne were abuzz - and St Justin's was right in the middle of the action. It was all happening at the annual STEM MAD (Make A Difference) Expo, where over 60 schools - both primary and secondary - had stalls showcasing projects to help save the world! Or at least make it a way better place to live.*

*The STEM MAD Expo is an event where schools are invited to acknowledge and promote STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Maths) learning initiatives that address real-world problems, and demonstrate how students in Catholic schools can take positive action.*

*Our stall showcased our Year 3 Aquaponic Project. We had several small aquaponic gardens on display, along with information posters, photographs and a cardboard version of our fish-tank set up. We also displayed a letter from the Year 3 group to Mr Torpey about the possibility of constructing a full-size aquaponic garden at our school. While the aquaponic project is a Year 3 initiative, our Year 3 LitSTEM students were away on camp on the day of the expo (Thursday, October 10). To stay involved - Jake, Luka, Marco, Charlie, Mark, Grace, Melissa and Adrianna - had travelled in to the Catholic Leadership Centre with Mrs Shiel, Mr Anderson and Ms Stewart to set up the stall the day before the extravaganza.*

*Sustainability leaders Emilia and Zara, from Year 5, represented St Justin's on the big day. They presented our project to the judges and flew the flag as other interested visitors - like students from other schools and representatives from Melbourne Zoo and the Royal Botanical Gardens - checked out our stall and asked heaps of questions. Emilia and Zara were terrific school representatives. They worked as a team and did St Justin's proud.*

*"I was a bit nervous at first," Zara admits. "The other schools had some good ideas. When the judges came around it was a bit nerve-wracking - but I thought we did well. We told them lots of information and answered their questions."*

*Emilia adds: "When we first arrived I was a bit nervous with the big crowd there. There were so many good creations...but I had high hopes for our stall. "We'd prepared the day before, during snack time and lunch. It was a bit nerve-wracking (talking to the judges) but we got through it well."*

*There was a wide range of ideas and themes on display at the expo. They ranged from animal conservation to environmental safeguards. There were projects about rocket science, electric cars, sustainable cities, coding and apps, and ideas on how to better help the disabled. While St Justin's didn't quite manage to receive an award on the day, everyone involved in our expo project came back to school as winners.*

*"It was really fun being there," Zara says. "I liked looking at other people's presentations about how they might be able to help the world." Emilia adds: "It was a great experience. I think because Zara and I are friends, we had more of a gel. We didn't talk over each other at all. It was a lot of fun." Zara agrees. "Emilia and I worked really well together because we're good friends. We didn't cut each other off and we really listened to each other. "I would definitely do it again."*



Mikayla started off with a goal of raising \$150 but soon realised she was on the way to raising much, much more. Mikayla had an amazing idea of asking Waverley Gardens Shopping Centre if she could use an area to skip in the shopping centre as a way of raising funds. This turned out to be an incredible idea. Mikayla was able to purchase some skipping ropes as well so young children and inspired adults could skip with her at the shopping centre whilst she was raising money. Along the way, Mikayla also had support from a Chicken Shop, Remedy Drink Company, Wendys and the Shopping Centre Manager.*

*Mikayla was on average at the Shopping Centre 3 times a week, skipping for approximately an hour each time. The initial \$150 goal was soon surpassed with her final amount raised being a whopping \$1140.80. What a fantastic effort Mikayla! 

### **MiniBoss Incursion**

*On Friday 18<sup>th</sup> October, the Year 3s and 4s had an Incursion called the "Creative Space" which helped us learn about cooperation and teamwork.*

*Firstly, we were put into groups of 6 for our first activity. In the first activity we had to use the hand that we don't write with to make a paper plane and we only had 2 minutes to do it. After that, we had to fly the best paper plane which we made to see which airplane flew the furthest!*

*Our second activity was to write down a list of rules that we had to follow in our group. Then we all had to agree on the rules that were created. Then we all had to brainstorm the rules that we had created on a whiteboard.*

*Our third activity was to write a list or brainstorm as many uses of a paper clips that we could think of. Some ideas which people wrote down were: a hair clip, earrings, chain, ring, bracelet, necklace and many more. Then on the whiteboard we had to write down all of our ideas.*

*For the fourth activity we had to use tape, spaghetti strands, string and a marshmallow to make the highest tower that we could that was steady and didn't fall over. To measure where the top was we had to place a marshmallow on the top without the tower falling over. For this activity, everyone had to help stabilize the tower or else the whole thing would fall over.*

*The fifth activity was to build a pom pom launcher or a marble racer using the materials inside the bag that was given to us. The people in your team had to share their ideas. After we were done, we walked around the classes looking at other team's creations and ideas.*

*The sixth activity was to get in one line and the person at the back of the line had to go and look at a picture then draw it with their finger on the second last person's back. Then it would keep on going until we it got to the first person and then the first person would draw on a piece of paper what they thought it was.*

*Our final challenge was to design a device that helped solve the problem which was read to us. The materials that we could use included: paper plates, plastic cups, glue, paper clips, balloons and other items you can find at home. This activity was for us to stretch our creativity and to share our ideas with each other. When we were done, we presented it to the other teams and told them the problems we had to solve.*

*Then we thanked Mini Boss for coming and teaching us cooperation and teamwork. Everyone had an awesome time – it was an amazing experience.*


