St Mary of the Cross - Mary MacKillop

Yesterday we celebrated the feast day of Saint Mary of the Cross with a whole school Mass. Mary MacKillop is the first Australian to be recognised by the Church as a Saint. She was a hard worker who put the needs of others before herself. She exhibited something of the larrikin spirit: constantly in dispute with authority but pressing on, regardless. She used the strengths of others but also didn't tolerate those who were not genuine. Her commitment to the schooling of children from poor and rural communities established a model of Catholic education that continues to today.

St Mary of the Cross' motto was "Never see a need without doing something about it".


Term 3 Assemblies




St Justin's Fair on the Hill – Student Stalls

Last year at our Fair on the Hill, the idea of having student stalls was initiated and it was a huge success. This year we are going to continue to encourage student participation at the fair with the introduction of "Biz Kid\$". Chris and Chris Brodie will be coordinating the Biz Kid\$ program which will provide an introduction and basic overview of how to successfully establish and run a small business (ie. a fair stall). Biz Kid\$ will be open to all students in Years 3,4,5 and 6 and students will have the opportunity to have a fair stall on their own or working in a small group.

The Biz Kid\$ program will be run over 5 lunchtime sessions and students will be encouraged and supported as they develop their mini business. We hope that parents will also play a part in providing support and guidance and act as a sounding board for their child throughout the process.

Our first session will be held on <u>Tuesday 13th August at 1:20pm</u> and we will be providing an introduction to the program and will answer any questions. Some children might be creative and already have an idea for a stall, some might be unsure of a stall idea but have an interest in the business side of things. Whatever the case may be any student is welcome to attend this first session to find out more.

LitSTEM is an exciting way to explore, create and learn by using our Literacy, Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics skills, all at the same time! When we can use these skills for the purpose of building a better life and a better world, we are actively supporting each other and we can be working towards a positive future for the entire community and our environment.

The Year 3 students currently participating in the class are Adrianna, Melissa, Grace, Luka, Mark, Jake, Charlie and Marco. Here's a quote from each of them about their involvement in the program - and their hopes for the future beyond the year 2040.



Adrianna: "We are doing LitStem to hopefully make the world a better place by having healthy families and taking care of our environment. I hope people stop polluting. I want everybody to be happy."

Melissa: "We are doing LitStem to help the environment. We are thinking of new ideas to help our community and the world. We have painted posters and watched videos."

Grace: "We are doing LitStem so that we can make sure we stay healthy and help the animals stay healthy. When Mr Anderson interviewed me about the future I said I hoped for more flowers in the gardens and more butterflies. We need lots of fresh air."

Luka: "We are doing LitStem to help the environment. Our aim is to stop pollution and to save animals from dying. In 2040 I hope there will be no cigarettes or illegal drugs. I have made stuff to help the environment and I've drawn pictures of what I want to happen in 2040."

Mark: "We are doing LitStem to save the planet. We should try to use less materials - by cutting down less trees. Animals live in trees, and if we cut them down it would be like our houses blowing up and we would have nowhere to live! I hope that animals have better lives in the future. And people!"

Jake: "We are doing LitStem to make the world a better place by learning about science. I drew some pictures about the future. I hope people don't hunt all the animals. I also wonder if aliens are real. Maybe we will find out."

Charlie: "We are doing LitStem to save the environment and to stop war. I did an interview with Mr Anderson about 2040 and I talked about scientists. We need to stop polluting and littering."

Marco: "We are doing LitStem to try to learn science and to make the world a better place. We can do that by stopping pollution and making new electric cars. We need trees."


