On behalf of the Parents and Friends (P&F) Committee we wish all our families at St Justin's the very warmest of wishes for Christmas and the New Year.

The P&F and its many sub-committees have maintained a steady constant stream of fundraising and community building events. More importantly the P&F has played an integral link in the life of St Justin's, building a strong sense of school and community spirit, something that we should all be proud of.

In 2018 we were fortunate to have 117 generous, active and hardworking parents and friends at St Justin's who donated time, money and energy towards our school and parish community. The P&F was filled with extremely active, enthusiastic members who worked tirelessly throughout the year to put on quality events and fundraisers. We truly thank each and every one of you for your enthusiasm, patience, support and dedication to the school, parish and the P&F.

Did you know that during 2018....

- The P&F hosted our St Justin's Open Day and 2019 Welcome to Prep Parents events
- 55 parents attended a working bee and 80 cubic metres of mulch (equivalent to filling both Prep classrooms floor to ceiling) was spread out into garden beds and playground areas
- The Easter egg raffle and wrapping day, consisted of 3 prizes per class room and 3 major prizes across the whole school
- 350 hot cross buns were eaten on our hot cross buns day
- 396 donuts were donated, which equates to 33 dozen boxes to celebrate St Justin's Day
- Mother's and Father's Day stalls
- Trivia night 169 people attended, 18 of these people were parishioners and 5 out of the 17 tables were Prep classes
- Kiosk Fridays terms 2 and 3 sold over 1500 packets of chips
- Pizza days 1440 slices of Margherita and Hawaiian pizza were ordered, which equates to 180 pizza's
- Hot Dog Days 750 hot dogs and hot dog buns
- Sausage Sizzle Days 840 sausages where turned and approx. 40 loaves of white bread
- Election Sausage Sizzle Day 15 loaves of bread, 20kg sausages and 6kg onions
- Twilight Sports Carnival 650 sausages were turned along with 30 loaves of white bread
- St Justin's P&F Class Reps informed parents of upcoming events, organised parent evenings out, organised birthday gifts, baby gifts, wedding gifts and Christmas gifts for teachers, assisted with the School Production and coordinated stall volunteers for the Fair on the Hill
- Bakers delight fruit mince and lemon Christmas tarts
- The Coles Sports for Schools program enabled more sports equipment to be available in the playground at playtime, as well as during PE lessons
- The uniform shop stocked our complete range of uniform requirements and it modernised its operations with the introduction of CDFPay, an online shopping experience


