#### Reconciliation

Next week our Year 3 students will receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time. This is a very special time in the children's lives and we ask that you keep them in your prayers. We thank the parents of these children who have prepared them at home and supported the work done at school by the teachers. Reconciliation will be held on Tuesday March  $23^{rd}$  at 7.00pm for Year 3W and Thursday March  $25^{th}$  at 7.00pm for Year 3SS. Adults are reminded that they need to wear a mask.



#### As we continue on our Lenten Journey. . .

Life can be a difficult ride, and each of us at times will know the pain, trouble, loneliness and struggle. That's why it is important for us to practise love and kindness. But when we are going through our own difficulties, when we are tired or feeling taken for granted, we might wonder what's the point?

What's the point of being kind? What's the point of continuing to be caring, helpful and polite? Have you noticed that emotional states are contagious? Hang around an angry person long enough and some of that will rub off on you. The same goes for depression. Uncaring acts beget more. Selfishness breeds isolation, disrespect, contempt and ugliness. Just as negative emotions have a negative impact in our lives, our emotional state and our thoughts travel from us like ripples on a pond. They radiate energy that affects everything and everyone around us. Eventually some of that energy will be reflected back to us, perhaps weaker, perhaps greatly magnified...

- Let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth. (1 John 3:18)
- Do not grow weary in good. (2 Thessalonians 3:13)
- Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. (Romans 12:15)
- Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfil the law of Christ. (Galatians 6:2)

#### Working Bee – Saturday 13th March

Our first Working Bee was held last Saturday and despite heavy rain, much was achieved. A huge thank you to all the families who were able to attend – we greatly appreciate your assistance in keeping our school looking immaculate. Our school was really well presented for Open Day and we received plenty of positive feedback on the presentation of our school.



#### Open Day

Yesterday we held our first official Open Day for 2021. We had a number of visitors to our school, many for the very first time. Whilst we had many compliments on our beautifully presented grounds, our amazing outdoor kitchen and our fantastic learning spaces, everyone commented that the school has a "lovely feel". This "feel" cannot be created by "bricks and mortar" but by the proud, caring people who help make our wonderful community. Thank you to all who help create the "lovely feel" - this is not something that you can just create for one day, but is a feeling created over time by people who genuinely care for each other.

A special thank you to the parents who helped in the registration tent, the Year 6s who so competently conducted tours of our school and to all staff and students who so willingly and proudly welcomed many visitors into our learning spaces.















#### Drop off and pick up

In the morning, there are two teachers on yard duty in the school grounds from 8:40am. If you wish to drop your child off before 8:40 am, please use the Before School Care service provided by Camp Australia - we would hate for your child to arrive at school and no-one be here to care for them. Whilst there is usually someone here around 8:00am, it's important to remember that staff are busy preparing for the day ahead or involved in meetings.

After school, a teacher is on playground duty until 3:45 pm. After this time students who are yet to be picked up will be taken to the office. We will attempt to ring their parents to make sure everything is ok. If, for any reason, you are running late, just give the office a ring and let us know.

Please note that students should not be dropped off or picked up in the staff carpark. In the morning and at the end of the day, the car park becomes a busy place with people walking in all directions.

#### After observing the 3:30 pm traffic in Grantchester Road, a few important reminders:

• Please observe the 2 minute parking bay. If waiting in this bay, <u>drivers cannot leave their car.</u>

- If waiting for a parking space, please never call your child to the middle of the road. It would be far safer to drive around the block and wait for a parking space rather than wait in the middle of the road.
- Please minimise the space between cars often we could park more cars if we parked a little closer to each other.
- Never park in the driveways or on the nature strips of our neighbours this can restrict the view of pedestrians and other road users. It's also very disrespectful.
- Stay calm and be patient there are often many parks available after 5 minutes a short wait in comparison to the waiting room at Monash Hospital.



Whilst these reminders are important to the safety of all concerned, they are the law. I ask that you all follow the rules and remain patient – everyone's safety is important. After five years, I've never seen anyone get frustrated by someone doing the right thing.

#### Cumberland View

On Wednesday, Grade 5SS visited Cumberland View to celebrate a liturgy with Fr Andrew and the residents. The students sang 3 songs and made St Patricks Day cards for the residents. The residents and students were absolutely delighted to spend some time with each other.





#### Professional Photographer

On Wednesday we engaged the services of professional photographers to help update our website. Tserlin and Mark (who had both been involved in developing our existing website), spent the day with us, trying to capture all that St Justin's has to offer – not an easy task by any means. 
All parent helpers are asked to attend a briefing session (approx 30 minutes) on one of the following dates:

Emotions are a funny thing - some of us are really good at acknowledging and explaining how we are feeling, others are really great at keeping these feelings in check and being able to act in ways that are appropriate for the situations we are faced with.

Sometimes though, feelings can sneak up and catch you unaware and off guard - we have big reactions that aren't always fitting or suitable for the situations we are in.

This is a space our kids find themselves in often - they are in the process of learning to identify all the emotions we can feel, what triggers these emotions in them and how they react when these feelings appear. This is a huge learning experience, one that we continue into our adult lives, and it's important for us to remember that children need our help, guidance and expertise in this area to help them navigate the tidal wave of emotions they will encounter.

The skills used to identify and manage our emotions are collectively known as Emotional Intelligence - it takes time and practise to recognise and manage these skills. Helping our children develop their emotional intelligence involves:

- Developing their emotional awareness being able to notice and identify the emotions they are feeling. Naming the emotion is sometimes enough to help children (and adults) feel more in charge of their emotions.
- Understanding and accepting emotions knowing why we feel the way we do. Modelling the language we use as we work to accept and understand our own emotions is a fabulous way to model how they can in turn develop this skill. For example, "I feel left out and a little unsure when my friends are playing a game on the playground and they didn't ask me to join in," Identifying the feelings and why they are present is a great starting point for a deeper conversation around the issues our children are facing.
- Accepting our emotions means noticing, identifying and understanding these emotions without blaming others or judging ourselves for how we are feeling. This is such an important part of building emotional intelligence we want our children to feel safe and secure in their environment so they will share their feelings with us and know that how they are feeling is

OK, there is no shame in not feeling great.

As we move towards the end of a very busy Term 1, it is to be expected that children might display some big emotions that they are struggling to manage - returning to school after the upheaval of 2020 has been a difficult adjustment for all and our children (and parents and teachers) are tired.




#### Wildlife Warriors

Our recruitment, screening, induction, ongoing monitoring and assessment for volunteers align with our Child Safety Policy and our Child Safety Code of Conduct and adhere to the requirements of Clause 10 of Ministerial Order No. 870 (Volunteers).

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St Justin's

St Justin's Primary School takes its commitment to maintaining a 'child safe' environment for all students and young people seriously and implores that all members of the school community, including volunteers, work with us to achieve this.

A volunteer is defined as any unpaid individual who provides support in educational, sporting, extra curricula or school community activities to the school. Their assistance is provided under the direction and supervision of identified school representatives.

Any parent who wishes to volunteer their services to the school must ensure they participate in the school's volunteer screening and induction procedures.

#### All volunteers must:

- Provide evidence (driver's license/Medicare card/passport) of personal identity
- Provide a valid Working with Children Check (WWCC)
- Respond to Volunteer Application questions
- Complete two Referee Reports for Volunteers that affirm that volunteer's suitability for working with children
- Meet with the Principal and/or Deputy Principal as part of our regular interview process. A Record of Interview will be completed at this time.

MINI Hot Cross Buns are \$1.00 each and are available in Traditional Fruit or Chocolate Chip


