#### Living the Gospel – Do you not care?

This week's Gospel is according to Mark 4:35-41. Mark tells the story of Jesus and the disciples being tossed around in their boat, almost swamped by a powerful storm. When the disciples approached Jesus, he was in the stern, asleep. They woke him and asked, 'Master, do you not care? We are going down!' He woke up and said to the sea, 'Quiet now! Be calm!' And the wind dropped, and all was calm again. Then he said to them, 'Why are you so frightened? How is it that you have no faith?' They were filled with awe.

The experience of the disciples as their boat was tossed about the sea by the powerful storm may sound like a familiar situation. At times in life we may feel that we have lost control of our situation and we are being blown from one 'disaster' to the next. At such times, we may find ourselves asking the question that the disciples asked of Jesus, 'Master, do you not care?' Jesus' reply to the disciples suggests that had they been calm and trusted in the slow work of God, then they would have made it through the storm unharmed.



Let us pray that amidst the times of a storm, we have faith and hope that eventually all will become well and that we know we can trust in the help of a neighbour, friend, family.

#### COVID Update

As you would be aware, the COVID 19 restrictions are changing on a regular basis. As of today, in summary the guidelines include:

- Parents can escort their child to the classroom external door in the mornings during drop off (8:40am-9:00am)
- Parents can come on site for pick up (3:30pm-3:45pm).
- Face masks should be worn outdoors where physical distancing of 1.5m cannot be maintained.
- Parents wishing to speak to their child's teacher are asked to email/phone first to arrange a time or send a note in the diary.
- *QR codes are now mandatory for all schools for:* 
  - o all visitors on school site,
  - o all parents who enter any school building when on school site, QR Codes can be found at all major entry points

- *QR* code check ins are not required to be used by:
  - o staff
  - o students
  - o parents who do not enter buildings, and come onto school grounds for drop off or pick up.
- Camps and overnight stays can take place across Victoria with no travel restrictions.
- Outdoor education, including excursions and overnight stays, for the purpose of outdoor education, are permitted.
- *Incursions are permitted at this time.*
- *Interschool activities are permitted at this time.*
- School tours for prospective students and their families can recommence density limits and record keeping registrations apply.
- Non-essential visitors can attend school sites density limits and record keeping registrations applies.
- School staff must carry a face mask at all times and wear a face mask indoors when at school.
- For the purpose of communication, teachers and education support staff are not required to wear face masks while teaching, but those who wish to do so, can.
- Face masks are recommended to be worn outdoors where physical distancing of 1.5m cannot be maintained.
- Children under 12 years of age and students at primary school are not required to wear face masks when at school.
- Visitors and parents must also observe face mask requirements.
- Non-essential meetings, gatherings and assemblies (that are attended by individuals other than staff and students) should be deferred or held remotely until Term 3.
  - Outside School Hours Care programs will continue contact Camp Australia for more information. Please note: Camp Australia will have their own separate QR code.

Please note: Existing sign in and out processes continue to be used to record visitor attendance, for legal and regulatory obligations

#### Front School Gate

A reminder that the driveway front gate has been automated. At the moment, it will automatically open at 7:00am every morning and close at 7:00pm every night. If you happen to find yourself on the St Justin's grounds at any stage and the gate is shut, simply drive over the yellow disk at the bottom, left hand side of the driveway and the gate will automatically open – it will close automatically shortly after. If there is any reason why you might need the gate open outside of these times, please check with the School or Parish office.

## **BOOK FAIR 2021**

The annual Book Fair is an opportunity for children to select books from the Scholastic Book Fair set up in our library. Our library receives a 'commission of books' to add to our collection!

Due to COVID, this year's Book Fair will run a little differently to previous years.

This week the children have had the opportunity to look at and discuss the books during their library session.

From this week's session they will have brought home their 'wish list'. Please discuss the books on their list with your child and decide together what is most appropriate for your child. The wish list is only a 'suggested list' and the choice is of course, yours.

Children will be able to purchase their books next week <u>during their library session</u> (Week 10 on Tuesday 22nd, Wednesday 23rd and Thursday 24th).

There are two options for purchasing:

- Children can bring their money to school in Week 10 and purchase their book <u>during</u> their library session.
   OR
- Parents can <u>pay online</u> (select VIC then type in st justins) and send the receipt number with their child to pick up their books <u>during their library session in Week</u> <u>10</u>. The receipt number location is on the wish list - this works like a credit note for your child.

When will your child have their library session?

Tuesday: Grade 6, Grade 3, Grade 5. Wednesday: Grade Prep, Grade 1 and Grade 2
Thursday: Grade 4.

Depending on the COVID guidelines, parents who wish to visit the Fair are welcome in Week 10 on Tuesday and Wednesday after 3:30.

COVID safe restrictions, particularly around the number of people in the library, WILL be in place and must be strictly adhered to and anyone entering the building must sign in using the QR code on the outside of the building.

#### **Vegetable Garden Bed**



- Investigating and providing a better solution for the chicken's water





#### **NEW JUNIOR SCHOOL READERS**

Lockdown was the perfect opportunity to 'spring clean' the junior school reader boxes. 300 new readers have been purchased and as such, 2 boxes of 'pre-loved' readers will be donated to schools in Fiji. The junior school students will be able to choose readers from the new boxes from the beginning of Term 3.

Just a reminder that a reading level is a teacher's tool - designed only as a teacher tool for making good decisions about how to support students. Text levels are NOT a "number," "score," or "label" - a level represents 10 text characteristics and reading behaviours they need to control at that level. Teachers use these levels to form groups and instruct students at point of need. It is not helpful to draw your child's attention to their reading level as it may become a competition between others and they might be reading at a different level in class, depending on the focus. Remember the books that are sent home should be easy to read, comprehend and most importantly, to enjoy!

Join in the activities during NRW and learn all about Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander histories, cultures and achievements.




