Sun Smart

A reminder that St Justin's Primary School is a Sun Smart School and as a result, all students are to wear their school hat that protects the face, neck and ears during breaks or lessons, throughout September to the end of April. Sun screen should also be applied at home before coming to school.

Over exposure to the sun presents a serious health risk. Students must, therefore, be educated regarding healthy UV exposure balance to help with Vitamin D and suitable sun protection, in order to be protected from overexposure to the sun whilst at school.

Students and teachers are encouraged to protect themselves from the harmful effects of the sun through strategies which use a combination of sun protection measures whenever UV Index levels reach 3 and above.

Sun protection should be used whenever UV levels are 3 or higher, especially between the months of mid-August to the end of April. During this time, parents should send appropriate sun screen to school and ensure that their child has a suitable hat.

COVID Safe Practices

Thanks everyone with your support with our Covid Safe Practices. These include:

- socially distancing,
- carrying a mask to wear if required,
- using hand sanitiser,
- greeting each other in a non physical way,
- signing in to register for contact tracing purposes, etc
- Any visitors who remain onsite for fifteen minutes or longer must do so for a specific, pre organised purpose and must register their presence for contact tracing. If you require time to discuss matters with a teacher, we ask that you please pre-arrange this via an email. Masks must be worn if meeting face to face with staff for longer than 15 minutes.

Other practices include:

- Staff and students will continue with hand sanitising and washing of hands regularly throughout the day.
- Drink taps are able to be used at school, as per late last year, however we still ask that students please have drink bottles at school.
- Sharing of food is still not allowed to aid the safety of students with medical and health needs.
- COVID safe practices such as displaying many signs and posters, sanitising throughout the day, adults maintaining physical distancing and wearing masks at times will continue
- Outdoor events can continue to take place with social distancing protocols in place and masks if distancing is not possible.
- Excursions and Camps are permitted to go ahead.
- Swimming programs can commence with some restrictions in place
- Interschool Sports will commence for senior students this term.

Morning Drop Off

- Morning Drop off will be between 8:40am and 8:55am
- Family members can either:
 - o kiss and drop from the street,
 - o accompany their child/children to one of three school gates, or
 - o accompany their child/children to the classroom external door.
- Please note: Parents are able to come onsite as long as your presence is under 15 minutes.
- If you need to remain onsite for fifteen minutes or longer, please register your presence via the office for contact tracing.
- If walking your child into the school grounds, please park outside the drop off / pick up zones to allow other families to "kiss and drop". Please be mindful of neighbours' driveways and parking restrictions, including the 2-minute parking zone along Grantchester Road.
- Please note that masks must be carried at all times. Hand sanitiser will be available. Please stay away if you are unwell.
- Year 1 parents are permitted to accompany their child/children to their classroom door, provided they wear a face mask.



Morning Arrival

Developing independence and responsibility in a child at a young age helps them develop lifelong problem solving strategies for the future. Being independent and responsible for their own things helps them approach challenging situations with greater confidence. Often as a parent, we want to do as much for our children as possible, because it's too hard for them, we don't have enough time, we are afraid of what others might think or we are afraid that they might get hurt. However, doing too much for our children can deny them the opportunity to learn valuable problem solving skills and resilience for the future.

Can we please ask that all students carry their own bag to and from school each day. This will assist our students in developing a greater sense of responsibility, ownership and confidence in tackling challenging situations, not only in the classroom, but on the playground as well.

We also ask that students to take full responsibility for their own things. In the morning we ask students to enter the classroom, greet their teacher and unpack their bag ready for the commencement of the school day. They are then free to make their way outside to play with their friends.



Please sign in

Please note that all visitors, contractors, visiting teachers to our school are required to sign in via the school

office and wear an assigned lanyard, **no matter how long the visit**. This is a practice we are mandated as a school to enforce under the Child Safe Standards, Ministerial Order 870.

The lanyard means that we can identify at a glance any non-teaching staff on our school grounds and have an idea of their purpose. The data base created via the iPad at the front office means that in case of an emergency, we can quickly access the data and inform necessary emergency services of who is on site. If you are a regular helper at our school

(which I know many of you are), please speak to one of the administration team who can set up a "Quick Pin" to make the signing in and out process speedier for yourself.

Please note that students arriving late and/or leaving early, are also required to be signed in /out by an adult via the iPad. Thank you for your cooperation.

CAMP SPORTS AND EXCURSIONS FUND

This is a Victorian Government initiative which provides payments to schools for eligible students to attend camps, sports and excursions. The amount payable for eligible primary students is \$125 and for those students this amount will be used to reduce their school fees.

To be eligible to receive the payment a parent or legal guardian of a student must on the first days of Terms 1 or 2 be an eligible beneficiary, who hold's a Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC), Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) or a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, or be a temporary foster parent and submit an application to the school.

Please collect an application form from the school office, complete and return as soon as possible. Payments will be made directly to schools from March 2021. Once received, these payments will be credited to school fees.

Any parent who applied for, and received, the CSEF last year IS NOT REQUIRED to submit a new form this year.
