### ***Easing of the Covid – 19 Restrictions***

*Due to the easing of Covid-19 restrictions, in conjunction with the Catholic Education Commission of Victoria Guidelines, and after consultation with the Parish Education Board and staff, commencing on Tuesday 9th March until further notice, St Justin's will change some of its daily practices, and in some cases, revert back to pre-Covid practices.*

#### **Face Masks**

- *As directed by the Victorian Chief Health Officer, from 11.59pm Friday 26th February, face masks are recommended, but not mandatory, for use by staff, students and visitors when physical distancing of 1.5 metres cannot be maintained. Face masks must be carried at all times.*
- *Face masks must be worn at St Justin's by parents who enter the Junior corridor at drop off, given the nature of the tight space and number of people. After school, parents are asked to please wait undercover or outside exterior doors to greet their child.*
- *Face masks do not need to be worn in the office areas when 1.5m distance can be maintained or outside the school buildings.*




### Morning Drop Off

- Drop off time will be between 8:40am - 8:55am
- There will be two staff members on duty during this time - One in the Undercover/Kitchen Garden area and the other on the Back Oval.
- Students are not allowed on the front playground/oval/basketball court before school.
- There will be no allocated drop off zones. Parents/carers are invited to:
  - make arrangements with Before School Care,
  - kiss and drop,
  - park (outside the 2 minute parking zone, bus zone, driveways, etc.) and observe their child walking into the school grounds,
  - park (outside the 2 minute parking zone, bus zone, driveways, etc.) and accompany their child into the school grounds,
  - park (outside the 2 minute parking zone, bus zone, driveways, etc.) and accompany their child into the classroom, taking note of density limits (2 -3 parents per classroom)
- Once students have unpacked their bags and greeted the teacher, they can go outside and play with their friends.
- When we ring the bell, students line up in the Undercover Area. Parents are welcome to stay for morning assemblies in the Undercover Area, ensuring they maintain social distancing. On wintery days, students will stay in their classroom (an announcement will be made).

### Afternoon Pick Up

- *Afternoon pick up will revert back to pre-Covid times (please note change):*
  - *Monday: 3:15pm*
  - *Tuesday - Friday: 3:30pm*
- *There will be one staff member on duty, based in the Undercover Area.*
- *There will be no allocated pick up zones or times (please note change). Parents/carers are invited to:*
  - *make arrangements with After School Care*
  - *arrange to meet their child at a designated spot, being mindful of the 2 minute parking zone, bus zones, driveways, etc.*
  - *park (outside the 2 minute parking zone, bus zone, driveways, etc.) and wait in a suitable spot, including:*
    - *the Undercover area (please ensure social distancing of 1.5m)*
    - *outside any pedestrian gates (please ensure social distancing of 1.5m)*
    - *outside the driveway gates. (please ensure social distancing of 1.5m)*
  - *Any child not collected before 3:45pm (3:30pm on Monday) will be taken to the office where arrangements will be made.*
  - *Be patient and considerate at all times, following all road rules – safety is everyone's responsibility.*

### Playground

- *During recess and lunch, students will be able to play in any designated area, with the exceptions:*
  - *The Senior Playground is restricted to Year 3-6 on designated days,*
  - *The Back Oval is timetabled for different year levels throughout the week*
  - *The Junior Adventure Playground is restricted to Years Prep - Year 2.*

### Parent Helpers


- *Parent helpers are now permitted to help in the classrooms. Please ensure you have:*
  - *made prior arrangements with the classroom teacher, and*
  - *registered as a volunteer at St Justin's (see the newsletter for more details)*
- *When helping in the classroom, the following requirements apply:*
  - *all parent helpers must register via the front office, collecting a "Parent Helpers" lanyard that should be worn at all times whilst on school premises.*
  - *parent helpers in the classroom need to wear a face mask, as this activity requires parents to be less than 1.5m away from students.*



Our recruitment, screening, induction, ongoing monitoring and assessment for volunteers align with our Child Safety Policy and our Child Safety Code of Conduct and adhere to the requirements of Clause 10 of Ministerial Order No. 870 (Volunteers).*



*St Justin's Primary School takes its commitment to maintaining a 'child safe' environment for all students and young people seriously and implores that all members of the school community, including volunteers, work with us to achieve this.*

*A volunteer is defined as any unpaid individual who provides support in educational, sporting, extra curricula or school community activities to the school. Their assistance is provided under the direction and supervision of identified school representatives.*

*Any parent who wishes to volunteer their services to the school must ensure they participate in the school's volunteer screening and induction procedures.*

*All volunteers must:*

- Provide evidence (driver's license/Medicare card/passport) of personal identity*
- Provide a valid Working with Children Check (WWCC)*
- Respond to Volunteer Application questions*
- Complete two Referee Reports for Volunteers that affirm that volunteer's suitability for working with children*
- Meet with the Principal and/or Deputy Principal as part of our regular interview process. A Record of Interview will be completed at this time.*



### Marine Ambassadors

The Marine Ambassadors had a lovely day out on Tuesday swimming with the seals in the bay at Sorrento. The weather was a little fresh but they all dealt with the conditions very well with resilience and gratitude. This was their first experience learning in a very hands on way about our marine environment. Next term they begin peer teaching sessions where they will gain confidence and experience teaching other students about their new learnings. We have some personal recounts from the Marine Ambassadors with a few photos of the day.

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### **Recounts from some of the Marine Ambassadors:**

I enjoyed seeing the stingray glide across the bottom. I also loved watching the dolphins race our boat to the pier. The thing I love about dolphins is that they are so friendly - it made the experience so much better. One of the funniest things was when everyone was shivering and I felt completely fine and was not shivering or cold! The seals kept pushing each other off the platform. It was the funniest thing ever. On our little beach walk, there was a lot of rubbish. I think people should just walk 2 metres and put it in the bin. The sea dragons and fish were amazing. They were so fantastic. It was really fun when Tom was really cold his hot chocolate kept nearly spilling. Special thanks to the people at Moonraker for making this whole experience happen. Thank you to all the teachers (Mrs. Deegan, Mrs. Stewart, Mrs. Herbison and Mr. Torpey) - it's a great experience and it's an honour for me to be a Marine Ambassador. by Will

I felt excited watching the seals push each other off the triangle structure in the middle of the sea. We also saw lots of anchored boats when we were walking across the sandy beach. The funniest thing today was when I was so cold that my hot chocolate almost came out of the cup! The Marine Ambassadors also saw a stingray at the bottom of the ocean. It was massive and it was almost 2 meters wide or bigger - but it was sleeping. At the start we saw some dragon fish. The boat that we went on was three stories high. The first story was where my group was, the second level was on the side where we saw the dolphins and the third level was the driver's seat. The message I give is that if you're at the beach, don't leave your rubbish on the sand because then it can get washed away in the ocean and pollute. The sea animals will think it is food and start to eat it and choke - so don't leave rubbish on the sand at the beach. Here's looking forward to bringing families and the community together for what will be a great day, save the date!


